

Collaborative Working Project between Chiesi Ltd and Manchester Royal Infirmary

Executive Summary

This summary has been written by Chiesi Limited with consultation and approval from the Collaborative Working Project Team, established with full representation of partners.

Post-Transplant Initiative for Optimising Nurse-led Engagement & Empowering Recovery (PIONEER)

Aim

To undertake a nurse-led clinic that identifies, through agreed clinical and demographic criteria, targeted post-transplant patient populations living in areas of high socioeconomic deprivation, as determined using the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD). The project specifically seeks to support patients from socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds and those residing within the most deprived communities (lower IMD deciles) who may benefit from personalised pharmacological and non-pharmacological support and guidance.

The intended objectives of this collaborative project are to:

- Review the assessment of the targeted patient population with an aim to provide personalised pharmacological and non-pharmacological advice, guidance and treatment.
- Implement a nurse-led clinic for appropriate patients (as agreed by the operational group).
- Evaluate clinical outcomes, Patient Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs) and Patient Reported Experience Measures (PREMs) to assess quality of life and patient experience.
- Produce a lessons learned framework to support future scale and spread locally and nationally.

Intended Benefits

For Patients

- Management of care that includes a personalised approach
- Shared decision making in post-transplant care
- Opportunities to have their voices represented

NHS

- Improved healthcare resource utilisation
- Identification of patients suitable for medicines optimisation
- Personalised pharmacological and non-pharmacological interventions for patients

For Industry Partner

- Better understanding of challenges faced by the NHS in delivering high-quality patient care
- Greater understanding of patient needs in post-transplant management
- Reputational gain associated with supporting NHS service improvement

Resource Contributions and Cost Allocation

This collaborative working project is supported through a proportionate pooling of resources between Manchester Royal Infirmary and Chiesi Limited. The total project value is £202,934.30. Chiesi Limited contributes £110,650.60 (54.5%) through direct financial support and staff time. Manchester Royal Infirmary contributes £92,283.70 (45.5%) through clinical leadership, specialist nursing, project management and administrative support.
