
77% would recycle their used inhalers on a more regular basis if they could just post them to a recycling centre.³



Having been successfully piloted in community pharmacies in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR), the Leicestershire **Take AIR (Action for Inhaler Recycling)** scheme is now available for patients discharged from Leicester General Hospital, Glenfield Hospital and Leicester Royal Infirmary as well, to safely and effectively recycle their empty or expired inhalers through the post. The service is for patients with a Leicestershire and Rutland postcode.

The service remains available to patients collecting their inhaler prescriptions from their community pharmacies in the LLR area.
